

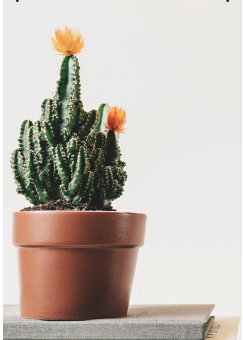


# Kick-off meeting Newsletter

## Our first task...

Sustainability Problem-Solving Toolkit: By providing a step-by-step guide, access to data and analytical tools, collaboration and communication platforms, this toolkit will help to reach the WP objectives by ensuring that target groups are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge (environmental awareness and understanding, data analysis and interpretation, design and prototyping, problem-solving and critical thinking, digital skills, such as data visualization and data management, collaboration and teamwork, sustainability assessment and evaluation, and entrepreneurial and innovation skills) to tackle climate change effectively.

Through the project activities, students from different countries will have the opportunity to work together on digital and climate change-related challenges, sharing their different cultural perspectives and learning from each other. Teachers will also be able to exchange best practices and innovative approaches and collaborate to develop new teaching methods that take into account digital skills and climate change

### FIRST STEPS AFTER MEETING
